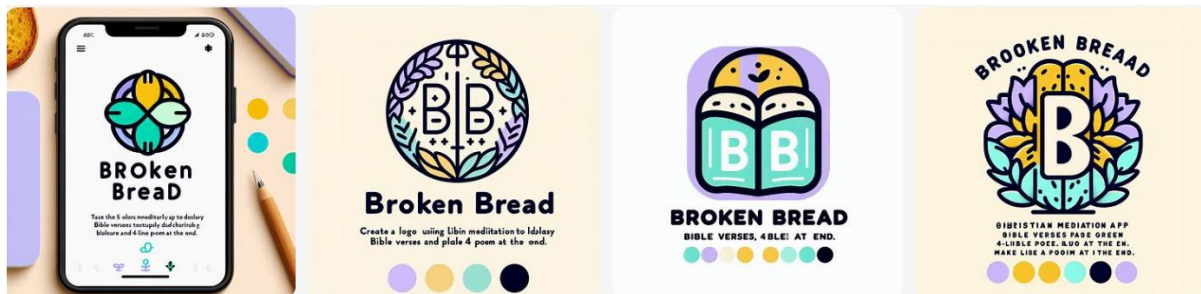

Logo Concept

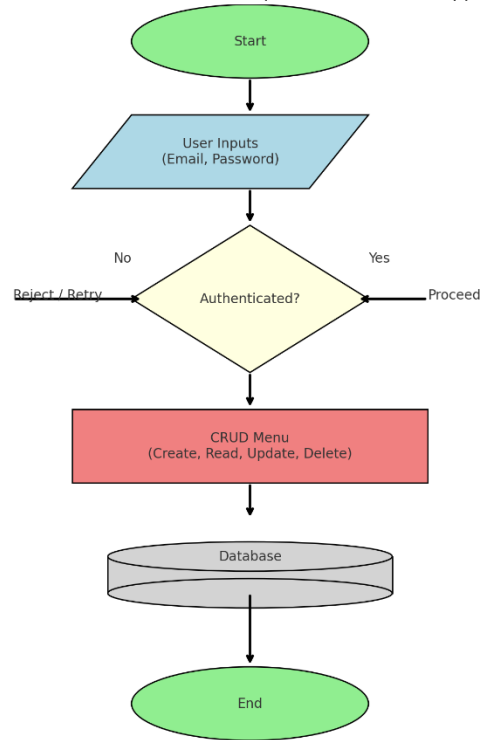

Step-by-Step Guide: Auto-Create Flowchart in Figma

 A. Use Figma with AI Plugin

You'll need:

- A Figma account (<https://figma.com>)
- Figma plugin: **“Autoflow”** or **“Diagram”** or **“AI Flowchart Generator”**

 B. Define Color Palette (AI-selected pastel tones)

Use these 5 pastel, psychologically uplifting colors:

D. Steps to Execute in Figma

1. **Open Figma** → Create a new file.
 2. Go to **Plugins > Browse Plugins** → Install **Diagram** or **AI Flowchart Generator**.
 3. Open the plugin and paste the above flow structure.
 4. Apply pastel colors manually:
 - Select node → Fill → Paste HEX code.
 5. Use **"Autoflow" plugin** to draw arrows automatically between nodes.
 6. Arrange nodes vertically or horizontally.

E. Export Screenshot

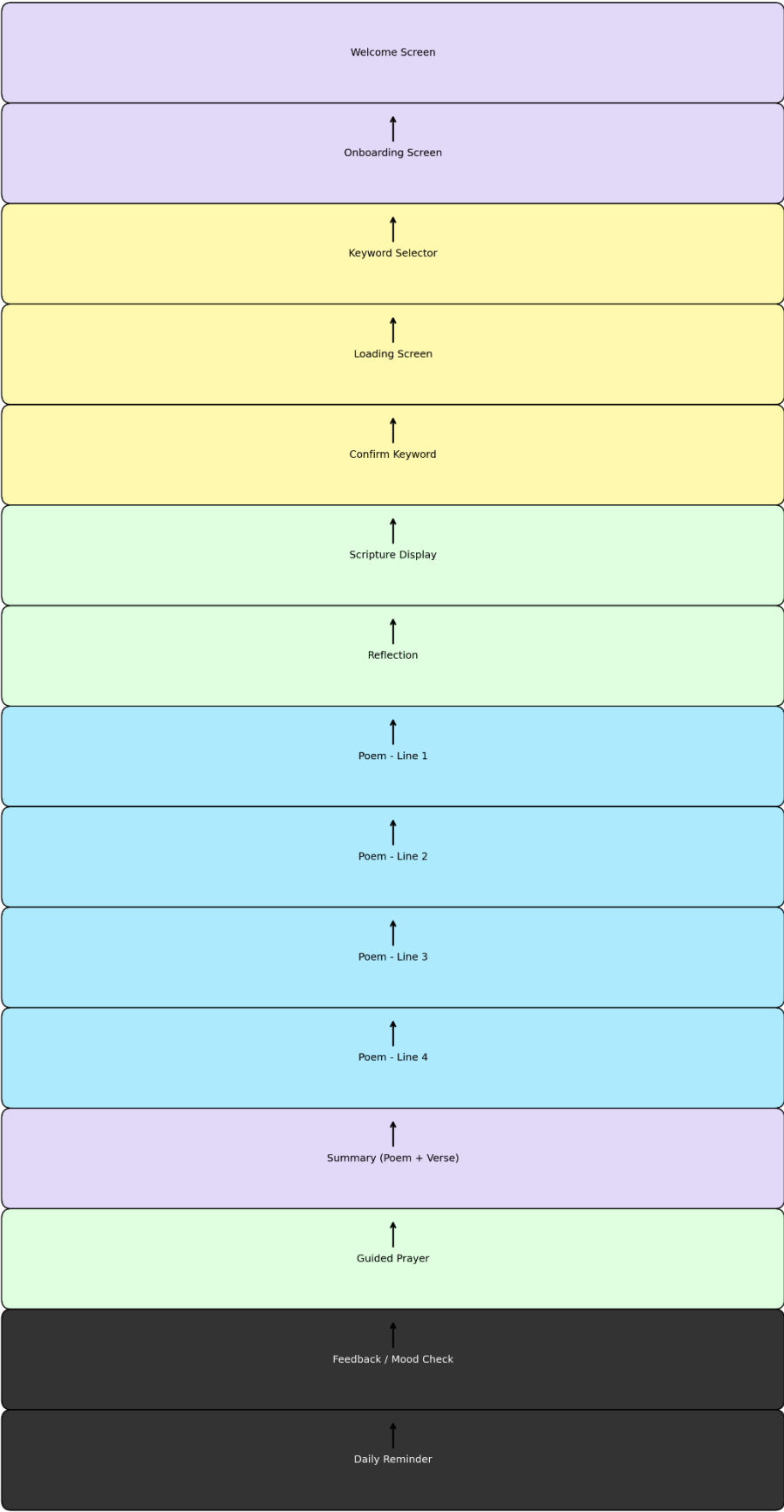
After customizing:
